Dear Washington Families,

The staff at Washington Middle School is pleased with the increase in student achievement this past school year. We are fortunate to have dedicated families, teachers and support staff who work together to create a positive learning environment. While we saw improvement overall, we did not make adequate yearly progress because not all subgroups met the requirements on mathematics and reading tests as defined by the Illinois State Board of Education.

As we analyze our building trend data and review individual student progress, we will assess and revise programs to meet the needs of our students and improve student achievement. During the 2009-2010 school year, Washington Middle School will:

- Conduct regular, focused discussion with staff content-area groups to assess programmatic strengths, weaknesses
- Conduct classroom observations to ensure that the staff is aligning lessons to the Priority Learning Standards
- Provide training and implement PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) in order to promote positive classroom climates and increase on-task learning time
- Implement RTI (Response to Intervention) in reading across all grade levels to address needs of our struggling learners
- Continue to implement Project CRISS (Creating Independence through Student-Owned Strategies) across all content areas to improve student learning
- Continue to provide READ 180 and Wilson Reading Intervention for appropriate special education students
- Continue to provide special education services in the general education classroom setting where appropriate to meet criteria of least-restrictive environment
- Provide opportunities for extended learning for students in the Enrichment and Talented program
- Continue to provide after-school homework support for all students, and
- Promote the Parent teacher Organization to encourage family involvement and interaction at school

In closing, please keep in mind that you are a vital part of the success of our students. It takes all of us working together for continued success.

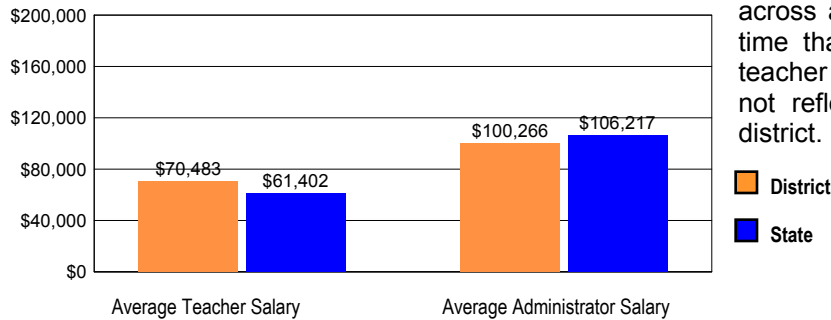

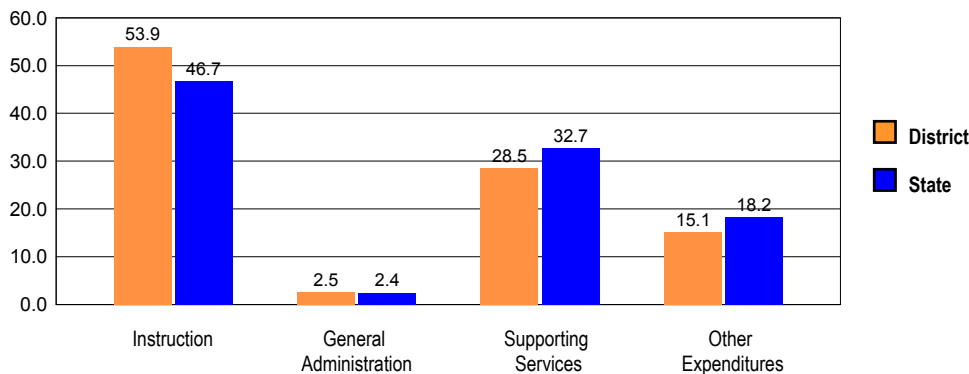
SCHOOL DISTRICT FINANCES

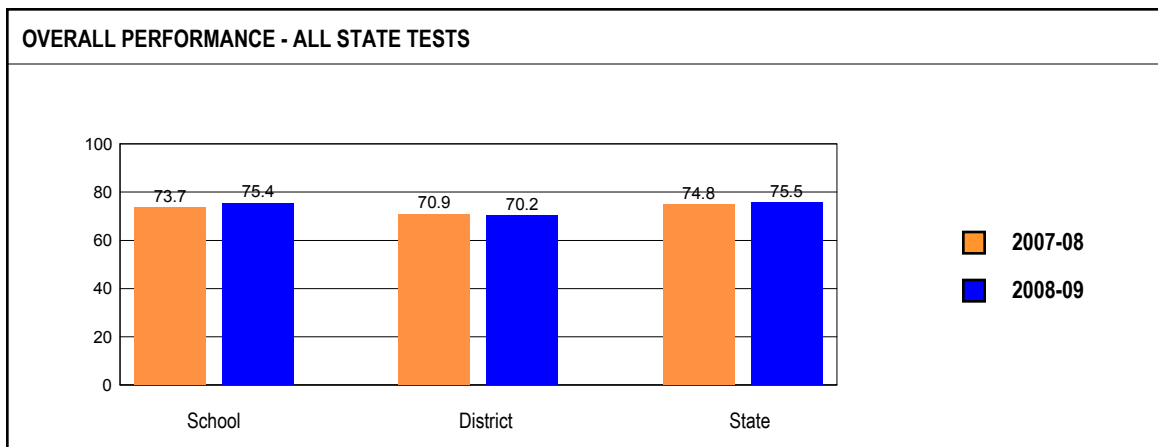

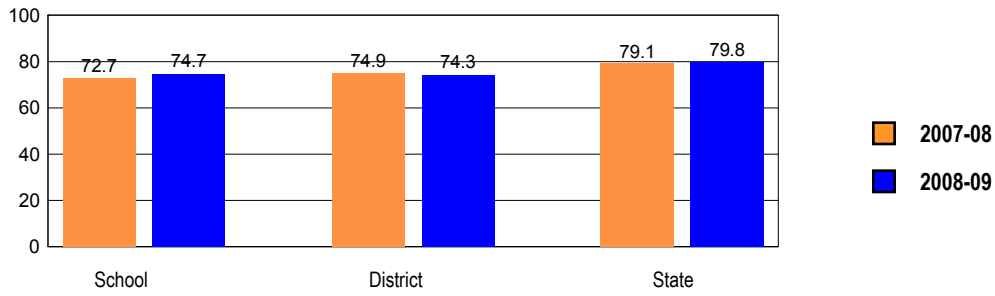
OVERALL STUDENT PERFORMANCE

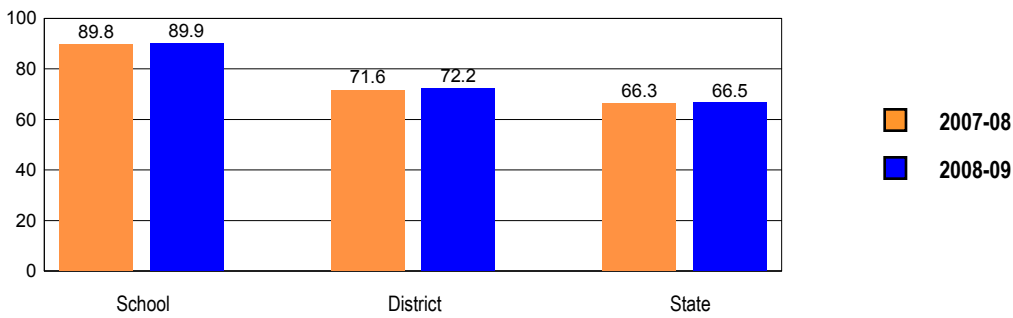

OVERALL ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT) PERFORMANCE



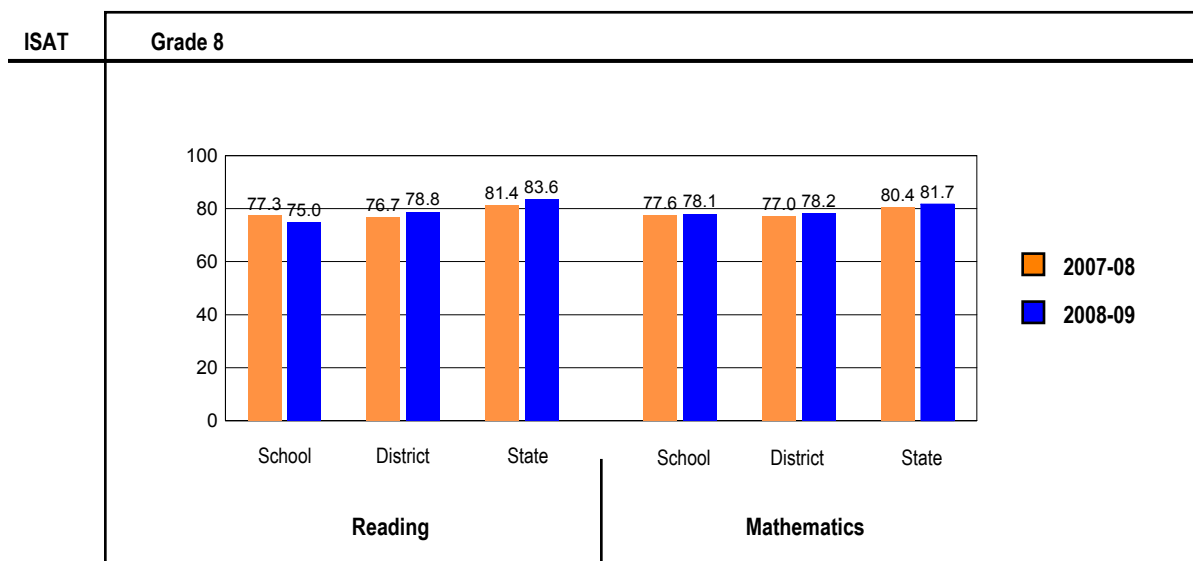
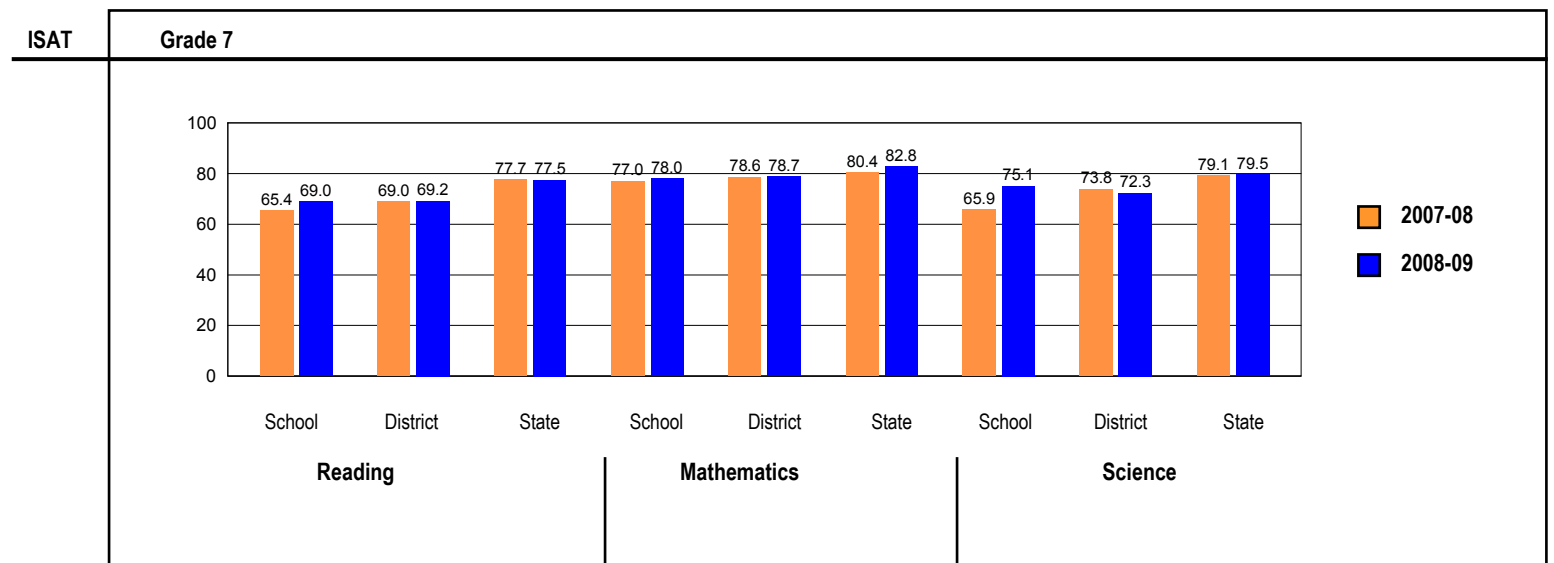
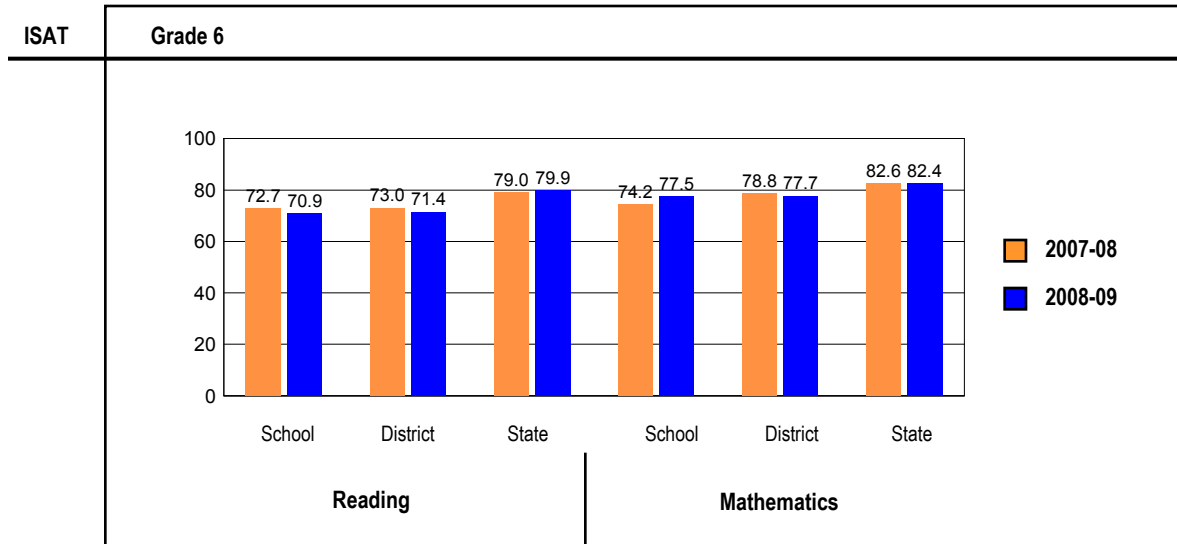
OVERALL ILLINOIS ALTERNATE ASSESSMENT (IAA) PERFORMANCE

ISAT PERFORMANCE

PERFORMANCE ON STATE ASSESSMENTS

Federal law requires that student achievement results for reading, mathematics, and science for schools providing Title I services be reported to the general public.

The Illinois Standards Achievement Test (ISAT) is administered to students in grades 3 through 8. The Prairie State Achievement Examination (PSAE) is administered to students in grade 11. The Illinois Alternate Assessment (IAA) is administered to students with disabilities whose Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) indicate that participation in the ISAT or PSAE would not be appropriate.

Students with disabilities have an IEP (No Child Left Behind Act). An IEP is a written plan for a child with a disability who is eligible to receive special education services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

Reading and Mathematics are tested in grades 3 through 8 and 11. Science is tested in grades 4, 7, and 11.

In order to protect students' identities, test data for groups of fewer than ten students are not reported.

ILLINOIS STANDARDS ACHIEVEMENT TEST (ISAT)

The following tables show the percentages of student scores in each of four performance levels. These levels were established with the help of Illinois educators who teach the grade levels and learning areas tested. Due to rounding, the sum of the percentages in the four performance levels may not always equal 100.

Level 1 -- Academic Warning - Student work demonstrates limited knowledge and skills in the subject. Because of major gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills ineffectively.

Level 2 -- Below Standards - Student work demonstrates basic knowledge and skills in the subject. However, because of gaps in learning, students apply knowledge and skills in limited ways.

Level 3 -- Meets Standards - Student work demonstrates proficient knowledge and skills in the subject. Students effectively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems.

Level 4 -- Exceeds Standards - Student work demonstrates advanced knowledge and skills in the subject. Students creatively apply knowledge and skills to solve problems and evaluate the results.
